A big shock came to five students and their parents at Burns High School. Laramie County School District # 2 had their board meeting on February 12th at Carpenter Elementary School. There was some recognition for the district at this meeting.

This week and next week the school board was being recognized for all their hard work. Being school board trustees is not for everyone. They have to be available, willing to go to the activities throughout the district, know about legislation, policies, and grants which are just a few of the items they need to know. They talk to parents during good times and bad times. The school board tries to make to best decisions for the students and parents about education. The board of trustees are the second parents and advisors that work hard to do their best to educate students.

Another recognition was the Teacher of the Year for Laramie County School District #2. Tania England, second grade teacher at Carpenter Elementary is always thinking out of the box to get the students to learn. England loves teaching young minds at Carpenter Elementary.

The last recognition of the night was Karlyn Theobaldt. She had designed a 2024 Iditarod. The theme was 25 years of Teacher on the Trail. It was selected by the artist Jon Van Zyle. She won the contest for the picture to travel with the dogs.

At the COW meeting with the school board the main concern was five of the Burns seniors that possibly did not qualify to graduate. The way the students and parents were informed was out of order. Until two weeks ago the students thought they were ready to graduate. Fact is the parents had a paper informing them of the last year requirements with their kids. But Missy Jackson and her daughter Charlie Marie Jackson found out different. They had just signed with a college out of Massachusetts. There was the possibility of losing \$30,000 worth of scholarship. But the Jacksons are not the only ones. Brook Hansen was another student

that had concerns too, but it ended up being five senior students. The board of trustees was notified about the issue. Chairman Mike Olsen looked up what the requirement was concerning the issue. It was only one class they were having an issue with. It seems they were informed they could not graduate due to not having taken a foreign language class in high school. Come to find out, the students had a paper that stated if the student took a foreign language class during the eighth grade then they did not have to take a foreign language class in high school. However, that changed last year. The school board changed it with the Hathaway Scholarship. Bottom line, it was confusing in the wording. The school board was willing to get it solved. They would like to make sure the students were educated. Principal Bobby Dishman wrote a waiver for the five students to be able to graduate. The board weighed all their issues about it, but all of the school board agreed that the students need to graduate. They worked hard to get to this point.

At the school board meeting Missy Jackson, Charlie Marie Jackson, and Aaron Hansen spoke to the board one last time for the board to vote for the students to graduate "This is not the students fault it is our fault," the board of trustees said. "We are not punishing them." There was a motion to create the waiver. The board of trustees approved. The board has a lot of work to do to clear up the policy of requirements for graduation. They are thinking of separating the school requirements and the Hathaway scholarship requirements.

Lance West gave a presentation of what is going on with the transportation department. They are getting four new buses. They are doing good with the route. Last year the school board received a service truck but it was is an accident, which totaled the truck. It was not due to driver error. The board voted to get another service truck. The school is still going to use the body for any vehicle.

In the COW meeting the school board was concerned about broadcasting the school board meetings. The school board thinks they barely have one person at the

meetings. The school board regular meeting is about the same except staff and their presentations. They are wondering if the parents are watching. The school board believes they get more responses out of the parents if they attend the meeting. They question everything. Time will tell in the end.

The building utilization committee has visited Carpenter Elementary and Burns Elementary. They are learning more about where people live, what the school needs, and much more. This is an eye opener about our school district. This committee was formed after concerns about Albin Elementary. They have found out so much more because of being able to look at all facts in each school. This committee is excited to explore more of the schools in the district.

Superintendent Justin Pierantoni informed the school board that in August the Accreditation people will be at the schools.

The recreation committee had a meeting before the school board meeting about the funding of the expansion of the Pine Bluffs gym. The meeting went very well. The school board will receive funding to do the expansion. It will be this summer for the construction.

Every school has a chance to show their school and how it is going for them. This time it was Carpenter Elementary. Principal Tyler Muniz went through what is going on at the school and how the students are doing on their education. He explained they have had up's and down's on education but they have figured it out.
